



California Industrial General Permit (IGP) Informational Workshop

Ten things you need to know about the Industrial General Permit (effective July 1, 2015)

ABOUT THE IGP

The Industrial Storm Water General Permit Order 97-03-DWQ (IGP) is an NPDES permit that regulates discharges associated with 10 broad categories of industrial activities. The IGP requires the implementation of management measures that will achieve the performance standard of best available technology economically achievable (BAT) and best conventional pollutant control technology (BCT). The IGP also requires the development of a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) and a monitoring plan. Through the SWPPP, sources of pollutants are to be identified and the means to manage the sources to reduce stormwater pollution are to be described. The IGP was adopted on April 1, 2014 and will become effective July 1, 2015.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

- Municipalities with corporation yards
- Industries holding existing IGPs with the State Water Resources Control Board
- Small industries not currently holding the IGP who may now require coverage

WORKSHOP DETAILS

This informational workshop will prepare you to obtain coverage from the new version of the IGP with the least amount of confusion. Topics covered will include a review of new acronyms in the IGP; steps to take prior to July 1; what happens on and after July 1; and how to update SWPPPs, BMPs, and procedures for compliance. We'll also cover how to become a Qualified Industrial Stormwater Practitioner (QISP); when you'll need a QISP; when a No Exposure Certification (NEC) might apply; and how to appropriately develop monitoring plans based on SIC codes. The workshop will be interactive with plenty of time for questions and answers.
